



## **MEJATC GRANT OVERVIEW (Journey-Level Training)**

### **What The Grant Will Not Do for Journey-Level Training:**

- **Will not cover all JW upgrade expenses. Existing funds must still pay for OSHA 10 courses, Significant Change courses, or any such course not specifically within the intent of the Grant structure.**
- **Will not allow for expenditures on normal (generalized) overhead as part of existing JW training.**
- **Will not pay for “mortar and brick” construction.**
- **Will not allow for any manner of spending not pre-approved by the MEJATC.**
- **Will not extend beyond January 2012.**

### **What The Grant Will Do:**

- **Will provide new opportunities for training in renewable energies, energy efficiency, power quality, advanced control systems, more efficient lighting, etc.**
- **Will provide for craft certification.**
- **Will provide for the purchase of a hybrid pick-up and a trailer for training mobility throughout the state.**
- **Will purchase mobile labs for training on solar, mirco-hydro generation, wind power, building automation, lighting design, power quality, FLIR imaging.**
- **Will allow for (at a minimum) one complete interactive solar system installation (at no cost to the Locals or JW training funds) in each of the jurisdictions. These installations will be incorporated into training courses.**
- **Will pay for teleconferencing equipment and installation at 4 locations around the state.**

- **Will, at no cost to JW upgrade funds, provide CEU classes and resources for any course related to the intent of the grant (renewable energy, energy conservation, energy efficiency, etc.)**
- **Will offset the cost of instructor training in related subjects.**
- **Will allow the JATC to purchase (and use for training) a wind generator and solar array at the training center in Helena, a resource library, computers, PLC trainers, craft certification labs, power quality meters, FIIR (heat) imaging equipment, etc.**
- **Through partnerships, welding facilities and a wind generator tower (for JW and apprentice certification and rescue training) will be available for use by those associated with the MEJATC.**
- **Will provide contractors and skilled workers with more opportunities in emerging markets.**
